Conducted by The Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR), the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz), and the Labor and Workforce Development Agency (LWDA). The event will continue building excitement and momentum and foster a community of practice, and build the statewide CERF network, including HRTCs, state agencies and departments, philanthropic partners, researchers, and more. An Inland Empire delegation will be in attendance.

We plan to host a state delegation of The Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR) and the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) in early April to highlight our work during the application phase of CERF and our vision for the future.

- Subregional Table: Subregional Tables: To reach diverse urban, suburban, and rural communities and create local options for engagement and decision-making, the IE HRTC will build and invest in six (6) place-based subregions: 1) Greater San Bernardino, 2) Western San Bernardino, 3) High Desert/ Mountain Communities, 4) Coachella Valley/Palo Verdes Communities, 5) Greater Riverside, and 6) Southwest Riverside County. Subregional leaders will ensure inclusion and voice, identify projects based on mutually agreed rubrics and HRTC sector priorities, and elevate local assets and plan to the regional level. Each subregion will have one local convener on the Inclusive Planning Council.
  - Greater San Bernardino: Fontana, Rialto, Colton, San Bernardino, Redlands, Highland, Loma Linda, and Yucaipa.
  - High Desert: Adelanto, Victorville, Hesperia, Barstow, Apple Valley, and Needles
  - Western San Bernardino: Chino Hills, Chino, Ontario, Upland, Montclair, and Rancho Cucamonga
  - Greater Riverside: East Vale, Jurupa Valley, Norco, Corona Riverside,
     Perris, Moreno Valley, Beaumont, Banning, San Jacinto, and Hemet.
  - Coachella Valley/Morongo Basin: Yucca Valley, 29 Palms, Desert Hot Springs, Cathedral City, Rancho Mirage, Palm Desert, Indio, Indian Wells, La Quinta, and Coachella.
  - Southwest Riverside County: Lake Elsinore, Canyon Lake, Menifee,
     Wildomar, Murrieta, and Temecula
- CERF Committees: The IE HRTC has five (5) CERF Committees with one lead member each: Governance, Outreach & Engagement, Data, Accountability & Plan Alignment, Sectors & Projects, and Comms, Arts & Culture. CERF Committees are responsible for the overall regional planning process. The cochairs for each of the Committees will serve on the Board of the Inclusive Planning Council.
  - Governance: budget, contracting, IPC process policy, and IPC structure development.
  - Outreach & Engagement: each: Press, Public, NPO (including biz org), and education, Coordinate with Public comms partners from Counties and cities; Coordinate Comms partners from within NPOs and education rapid distribution, Website established with all forms and materials IEGO Staff to add website information, Attend forums to discuss HRTC activities, finding, and actions.
  - Data, Accountability & Plan Alignment: Development of a research process and strategy, develop CERF Planning document.
  - Sectors & Projects: Potential projects, specific needs for the region, identify projects related to industry clusters in the region.

- Comms, Arts & Culture: provide information and data centered around the lived expresses of communities in the inland empire, Create a network of orgs in the arts.
- Equity Councils: The IE HRTC will create, based on feedback during the application process, seven Equity Councils with one lead member each serving on the larger Inclusive Planning Council: Youth, Workers, Tribal Communities, and Women, Racial and Social Justice, Environmental Justice, and Justice Reform. Equity Councils will create the space for impacted populations to plan, learn, reflect, and advocate for their interests within the IE HRTC. The Equity Council will also include an incubator space to assess the need for new equity councils.

  - o Equity Council Environmental Justice
  - Equity Council Justice Reform
